

COUNSELING

Counseling services are an essential part of the educational mission of the District. The Chancellor shall ensure that counseling programs are offered at both colleges.

The counseling programs shall be offered in person and online to all prospective and current students and shall include, but not be limited to the following:

1. Academic counseling – assists the student in assessing, planning, and implementing their immediate and long-range academic goals;
2. Career counseling – assists the student in assessing their aptitudes, abilities, and interests, and provides the student with current and future employment trends;
3. Personal counseling – assists the student with personal, family, or other social concerns as related to the student’s education; and
4. Coordination of services – coordinates with campus support services and programs provided for students including students with disabilities.
